"Hotel" by Arthur Hailey. The scene is the St. Gregory hotel in the busy, tumultuous city of New Orleans. Time: 1964. Through five eventful days we share the fortunes, conflicts and intimacies affecting the hotel, its guests, its echelon of management.

"The Duluth Mongoose" by Jack Denton Scott. This is a book about a mongoose named Mr. Magoo, the only one of his breed who is a legal resident of the continental United States. President John F. Kennedy heard about the events and said, "Let this story of the saving of Mr. Magoo stand as a classic example of government by the people."

"The Cook" by Harry Kressing. This is a story about a man who knows what he wants—and how to get it. John Fowles writes: "I have much enjoyed 'The Cook,' for I am very fond of Satan."

"The Ku Klux Klan" by William Peirce Randle. What are we really like, we Americans? Not all of us, to be sure, hate with such passion that we are a violent people. But in our horrified revulsion from some reported crime of intolerance, do we consider that the fault may in some part be our own?

"The Source" by James A. Michener. This is the story of our universal heritage from the past—a story not only of human greed, bigotry and cruelty, but of human striving for law and justice, love and faith.
