Elderly Nu Acres Couple Molested While Doing Chores

NU ACRES—Early last Thursday evening, Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Durham, an elderly couple and longtime residents of this community, went to the barn to milk their cows.

Omar Maine, a nearby neighbor, saw the auto and went to investigate. He found no one in the vehicle, but recorded the license plate number, and as he started up the hill he met the Negro walking rapidly to the automobile.

Maine continued on his way and decided to stop at the Durham place to see if they were all right. Going into the house, he found a badly frightened couple and Mrs. Durham covered with blood.

While the Negro man appeared at the barn door and ordered them to return to their house. He followed, ordering them into the dwelling.

Durham went in first, and as his wife entered she attempted to close the door. The man grabbed her cane and hit her twice on the right side of the head. He was ready to hit her again when she did manage to get the door closed.

By that time Durham had gotten his gun from the back room, and on seeing the weapon, the assailant quickly fled to a draw south of the house where he had left his car with the headlights turned on.

He was captured in Parma only minutes later, and the Durhams were taken there to identify him.

Upon receiving the license number from Maine, Sheriff Hays immediately broadcast it. The man gave his name as Mose Cannon.

He was known to have been employed on the Durham farm by their renters during hay stacking season about a month prior to the attack.

Cannon, 40, of Parma, was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Celia G. Settle Friday morning on charges of aggravated assault and battery.

He is being held in the Payette county jail in lieu of \$500 bail to await preliminary hearing.
