Graveside Rites Held for Young Son of Dimmitts

Graveside services for Jerry Lee Dimmitt, 2½-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Orland (Lee and Janet Barkdull) Dimmitt, were conducted at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, Oct. 26, 1965, at Nyssa cemetery. Officiating was Father Cletus Kirkpatrick of St. Bridget's Catholic church.

The small boy succumbed around 5 o'clock Saturday evening at Malheur Memorial hospital, where he was taken after swallowing an estimated 16 tablets of a drug prescribed for his mother. She was scheduled to undergo surgery Tuesday morning at the local hospital.

The child's act of taking the pills around 11 a.m. went unnoticed until he became violently ill.

Jerry Lee was born Jan. 9, 1963, at Malheur Memorial hospital and had since resided in Nyssa.

In addition to his parents, he is survived by a sister, Cindy Kay, who is 1½ years old; his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Dimmitt of Nyssa, Mrs. George A. Freitag of Burns and Howard Barkdull of Kaysville, Utah.

Also surviving is a great-grandfather, O. J. Dimmitt of Sargent, Neb.; two uncles, Roy Dimmitt of Nyssa and Paul Freitag of Burns; an aunt, Sheila Dimmitt of Nyssa. Services were under direction of Lienkaemper funeral home.
