Mrs. Laura Emmer Davis, mother of Mrs. Charles E. (Cor) Share of Nyssa, succumbed Monday evening, Nov. 15, 1965, at Malheur Memorial hospital following a month's illness.

She was born Dec. 6, 1878, at Butler, Tenn., a daughter of Samuel and Susan Allen Robinson. In September 1897 she was united in marriage to William W. Davis at Butler.

In 1905 the family moved to Indiana where they resided until 1908 when they went to Harney Valley near Burns, Ore. They came to Nyssa in 1918, residing in this area until 1936 when they moved to Dallas, Ore.

Mrs. Davis had been a resident of Malheur Memorial nursing home for the past eight years.

She was preceded in death by Mr. Davis in 1943 and two sons, Earl on Aug. 1, 1952, and Arthur on April 18 of this year.

Mrs. Hipp succumbed at 9 o'clock Tuesday morning at Malheur Memorial hospital where she was admitted after suffering a stroke the previous Sunday. Early in May this year she suffered a serious heart attack and was hospitalized at that time.

Former Nyssan Dies in Crash Of Jet Airliner

A former Nyssa resident, Ronald G. Whittaker, vice president and general sales manager of Amalgamated Sugar company, was among those killed when a Boeing 727 jet airliner crashed last Thursday night at the Salt Lake City municipal airport.

Mr. Whittaker had been with Amalgamated since 1935, came to the Nyssa plant as cashier in 1938 and 13 years later was transferred to Ogden, Utah.

While residing in Nyssa, he served for one term as mayor, was a member of the school board and president of the Lions club. At that time he was married to the former Laura Johnson who succumbed in November 1951. They were parents of two daughters, Carol and Sharon.

Mr. Whittaker went to Portland in 1951 as Amalgamated's northwest district manager and six years later returned to Ogden as assistant general sales manager. On Jan. 10, 1953, he was united in marriage to Barbara Ann Hayward in Portland and they became parents of two sons.

In addition to his widow, Barbara, and sons, Keith and Kent of the home, Mr. Whittaker is survived by his two daughters, Mrs. Richard (Carol) DeLand of Salt Lake City and Mrs. Wayne (Sharon) Mayberry of Roy, Utah.

Other survivors include his mother, Mrs. Ivy Goddard Whittaker of Ogden; two brothers, Stan of Ogden and Samuel Robert (Bob) Whittaker of Nyssa; one sister, Mrs. Barney (Betty) Daley of Ogden. Three grandchildren also survive.

Funeral services were conducted Monday morning, Nov. 15, 1965 at Larkin Mortuary in Ogden. Among those attending the rites were the deceased's brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. S. R. Whittaker of Nyssa. They returned home Tuesday evening.

John Shaw Services Conducted Tuesday At Ontario Chapel

Range Bull Sale By Idaho Cattlemen At Caldwell Nov. 24

The Idaho Cattlemen's association will sponsor its eighth annual fall Range Bull sale Wednesday, Nov. 24, at the Davis Livestock Auction, according to word received from Colin McLeod Jr., Caldwell, chairman and manager of the sale. The event will begin at 12 noon with Clayton Tschirgi, Fruitland, as auctioneer.

McLeod stated this will be the largest all-breed range bull sale held in this area, with 19 head of Angus, 10 head of Shorthorn, five head of Charolais and 65 head of polled and horned Hereford bulls consigned by purebred cattle breeders from Washington, Oregon, Utah and Idaho.

All of the bulls are over 16 months of age and will be graded into classes of A, A-minus, B-plus and B by qualified cattlemen. Grading will start at 8:30 a.m. Wednesday morning at the Davis Livestock Auction, followed immediately by the sale.

McLeod also stated that this will be the second time the association has sponsored a range bull sale where the bulls will not be halter broke nor led into the sale ring nor pampered in any way. He said the bulls will not be highly fitted and will show excellent type, breeding characteristics, dependability and will have the ability to produce top calves.

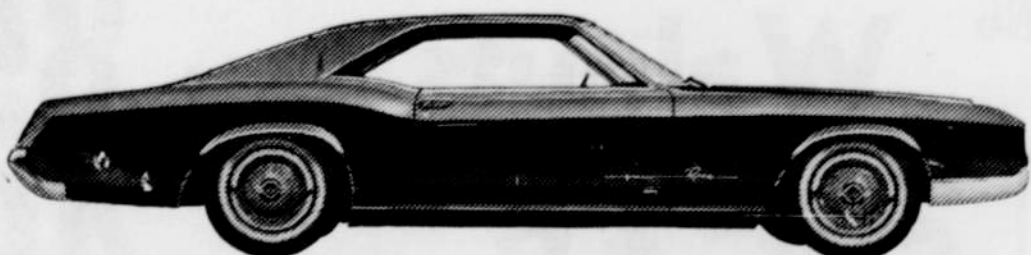
