Traffic Group Sees State Death Toll of 660

Oregon's 1965 traffic death toll already has surpassed last year's count with all of December yet to be recorded, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

Last year's record of 578 was exceeded on Nov. 17. If the current rate of increase over 1964 continues, the Traffic Safety and Education division of the department says the final death toll for this year could be about 660.

Officials urged drivers and pedestrians to practice greater courtesy and patience in traffic and to obey all traffic laws. December, officials noted, always produces one of the worst accident totals of the year, a fact which they attribute in large part to the "holiday" season.
