Mr. Whitaker succumbed Saturday at his home in Nyssa following a third heart attack. He suffered earlier attacks in 1957 and 1960. His death came just 16 days after his brother, Ron, was killed in the crash of a jet airliner at Salt Lake City. He was born July 19, 1919, at

Ogden, Utah, a son of Samuel Francis and Ivy Goddard Whitaker and attended both grade and high schools in that city.

He came to Nyssa in 1942 and on May 2 that year was married to Ruth M. Rands at Winnemucca, Nev. Mr. Whitaker had been employed by Amalgamated Sugar company for over 24 years and worked as scoop operator, mechanic and at time of his death as assistant dump foreman.

The deceased was a member of the LDS church and served for three years as radio operator in the Army Air Force. His favorite hobbies were mechanic work, fishing, game and rock hunting.
