Subsequently, Clara Barton was instrumental in founding the American Red Cross and served as its president for many years.

Tinsel on the Christmas tree began, so legend says, when spiders covered with webs a tree that had been decorated by a mother for her many children.



The poem appeared anonymously, because Dr. Moore felt that he, as a professor of divinity, should not be associated with such "undignified" work.

For more than 20 years, he refused to take credit for the poem. In 1844 the verse was published and for the first time credited to its creator, Clement Clark Moore.


