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Idaho Rites Held For Native Nyssa, William P. Morey

Final rites for William P. Morey, a native of Nyssa, were conducted yesterday afternoon, Dec. 22, 1965 at Peckham-Dakan-Davis chapel in Caldwell. Officiating was the Rev. Ernest Chamberlain of the Caldwell First Christian church. Interment was made in the Hillcrest cemetery there.

Mr. Morey succumbed late Sunday in a Caldwell hospital.

He was born Dec. 11, 1892, in Nyssa, attended local schools and was graduated in 1913 from Nyssa high school. He then studied at the Idaho Industrial school in Weiser and at a Portland trade school.

In 1917 he was married to Minnie Geesa at Weiser. After serving for seven months with the Army of Occupation in France at the close of World War I, he and his wife resided in Boise for a year before moving to Caldwell.

Mr. Morey was a member of the Christian church and past president of the men's Bible class. He was also a member of the Caldwell Legion post and treasurer at time of his death.

During recent years Mr. Morey attended reunions of early-day Nyssa students, an event held annually in Nyssa south park, and he had retained a close relationship with several longtime Nyssa residents.

In addition to his widow of the home, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Thelma Mae Rousey of Boise; one sister, Mrs. Ethel Logan of Oakland, Calif., and six grandchildren. A daughter, Mrs. Velora Faylor, died in 1962 at Nampa.

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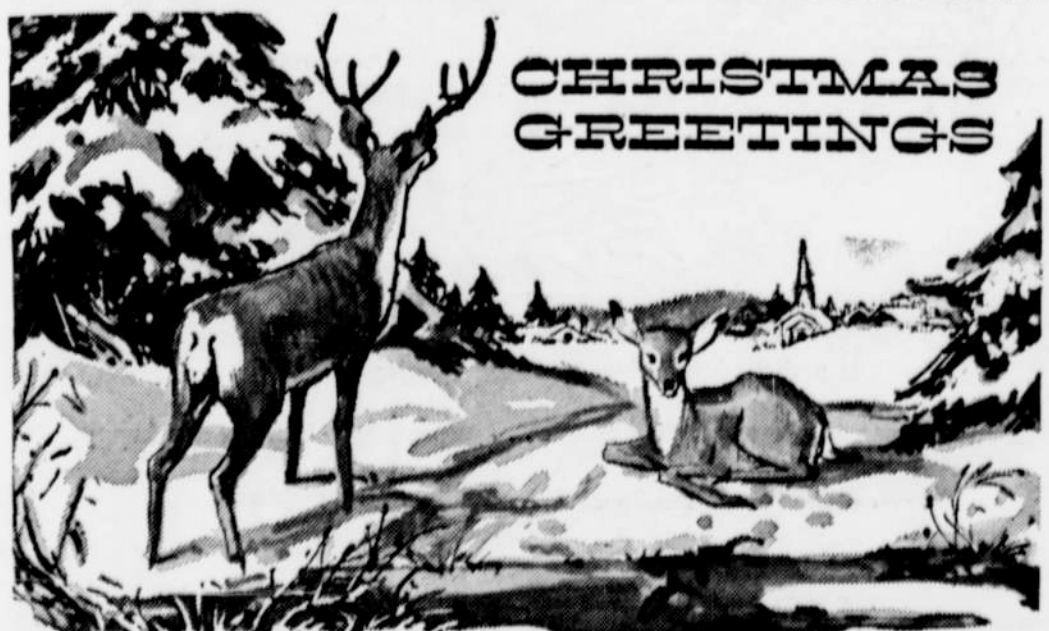


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
