ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS
Sealed proposals for the construction of water system improvement, 1965, for the City of Nyssa, Oregon, addressed to the Honorable Mayor and City Council, City of Nyssa, Oregon, will be received at the office of the City Manager, City Hall, Nyssa, Oregon, until 8 p.m. Mountain Standard Time, on the 11th day of January, 1966, and then will be publicly opened and read.

The work contemplated consists of construction of two pump stations, complete with vertical turbine well pumps, electrical and diesel drivers, pipe valves and fittings, metering and chlorination systems, and an electrical control system, and construction of approximately 1800 linear feet of 10-inch, 12-inch and 16-inch transmission pipeline.

Plans and specifications may be examined in the office of the City Manager, City Hall, Nyssa, Oregon, or at the office of Cornell, Howland, Hayes & Merryfield, Consulting Engineers, 414 North First Street, Boise, Idaho. A copy of said documents may be obtained at the Consulting Engineer's office at P.O. Box 829, Boise, Idaho, on request upon a deposit of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each document. The full amount of the deposit will be refunded if said documents are returned in good condition within ten (10) days after the award of the Contract.

Bidders must be prequalified in accordance with the applicable parts of Chapter 279 of Oregon Revised Statutes. Prequalification forms, completely filled out, shall be mailed to the City Recorder, City Hall, Nyssa, Oregon, at least ten days prior to the bid opening.

Each proposal must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond executed on the prescribed form payable to the City of Nyssa, Oregon, in an amount not less than five percent (5%) of the amount bid.

The successful Bidder will be required to furnish a bond for faithful performance of the Contract in the full amount of the Contract price.

The right is reserved to reject any or all proposals, to postpone the award of the Contract for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days and to accept that proposal which is to the best interests of the City of Nyssa, Oregon.
