The John Day Prospectors invaded Nyssa territory last Friday night and defeated the host team 46-43 in the Bulldogs' first home game. The lads in blue and white trailed 27-19 at the half and 31-25 at the beginning of the final stanza.

The Bulldogs rallied in the last quarter and scored 18 points but it was not enough to overcome the Prospectors' lead, plus an additional 15 counters earned by them.

Brad Maxfield led the Nyssa scoring with 12 points, followed closely by Terry Oft with 11. Other Bulldog baskets were made by Gene Brown, 7; John Moore, 6; Neal Bohannon, 3; Dick Finger, 2; and Mike Kodama, 2.
