

Bulldog Wrestlers Take Undisputed Lead in SRV-A League Competition

Scoring a 27-18 victory Tuesday evening over the Capital high Eagles, the Nyssa Bulldogs took over undisputed first place in the SRV-A conference wrestling contest.

It was the first league loss against three wins for the Eagles. The Bulldogs' league record stands at 4-0 and they hold a 7-0 tally for the entire season.

Bulldogs Defeat Vale 61-59 in SRV League Tilt; Lose 68-58 to Vallivue

A 61-59 victory over Vale and a 68-58 defeat by Vallivue were results of NHS cage tilts during the past weekend.

The Bulldogs got off to a good start Saturday night against the Vale Vikings and rolled to an easy 19-6 lead at the end of the first quarter. The lads in blue and white were out in front by a 38-20 score at halftime.

During the third quarter, the Vikings started to rally and the scoreboard read 44-38 (still in the Bulldogs' favor) at the beginning of the final period. The boys from Vale continued to fight back all during the last eight minutes and scored 21 points, with the Bulldogs getting 17 counters.

The final tally stood at 61-59 when the buzzer sounded and Nyssa fans were jubilant over the two-point victory.

Terry Oft, the Bulldogs leading scorer, was high man for both teams, hitting 21 points. Other counters were made by Dick Finger, 12; Tom Moore, 11; John Moore, 8; Paul Smit, 6; and Brad Maxfield, 3.

Lose to Vallivue Falcons

The Bulldogs suffered an SRV conference loss Friday evening, bowing to the Vallivue Falcons by a score of 68-58. Nyssa led at the end of the first quarter, 14-11, but were overcome at the end of the half, 38-27. At the end of the third quarter the score read 53-45. Oft led the Bulldogs with 21

points, followed by Finger with 10. Other NHS scorers were Tom Moore, 8; John Moore, 6; Maxfield, 4; Neal Bohannon, 3; Smit, Gene Brown and Mike Kodama, 2 each.

Nyssa now has a 1-1 record in SRV play and a 3-5 tally for the season.

The Bulldogs travel to Emmett Friday night and will go to Meridian on Saturday evening.
