The record books contain data of the projects that the student prepared for Vo-Ag. The scores that they received on the books will be counted on their applications for the State Farmer Degree. The members applying for this degree in Nyssa chapter are Bishop, Ure, Gary Moss, Terry Oft and Axel Stephen.

Some of the minimum qualifications for the degree are that the applicant must have been an active member of FFA for at least two years and hold the degree of Chapter Farmer; demonstrate proficiency in parliamentary procedure; must have an investment of at least \$500 in a project of his own; and must show outstanding ability of leadership and cooperation.

The candidates will be interviewed by state officers and complete a written test. Because only 2 percent of the state membership may receive the State Farmer Degree annually, competition is keen.
