

### Bulldogs Defeated by Huskies; Nearly Scalp Warriors in Saturday Contest

The Nyssa Bulldogs lost two basketball games in SRV-A league competition during the past weekend. They were defeated 58-47 by the hosting Emmett Huskies on Friday evening and went down at the hands of the league-leading Meridian Warriors 53-52 in a close contest Saturday evening on the Idaho court.

The Huskies and Bulldogs were tied at 13-all at the end of the first period and Nyssa trailed by a 27-24 tally at half-time. The Huskies seemed to gain momentum as the game progressed and led 42-31 at the beginning of the final period. Both teams scored 16 points in the last eight minutes of play, but Nyssa could not overcome the lead already racked up by the Huskies.
