Payette Man Named President of Horse Racing Association

Leo Marsters of Payette was named president of Snake River Valley Horse Racing and Breeders' association at the group's annual election meeting held Jan. 11 at the Moore hotel in Ontario. He replaces Ed Frost who had held the position for several years.

Also named to office were Ray Plaza of Ontario, as vice president; Dow Meek, five-year director; and Frost, four-year member of the board.

Hap Logue was re-elected secretary-treasurer, while holdover directors are Neil Dimmick of Nyssa and Pete Goodman of Payette.

Members of the association decided to hold their annual spring horse sale on April 17 and named Frost and Logue as delegates to the Jan. 14-15 Idaho association meeting held in Burley.

The group voted to raise the purse on all races this year by about \$1,200 and racing dates have been set for June 16-18 and June 23-25.

The association's financial report revealed that a sum of \$26,423 was taken in from last year's race meet. Expenses totaled \$23,093, leaving a balance of \$3,330. A total of \$3,562, spent for fairground improvements, was also reflected in the report.
