

### Bulldogs Lose Recent Games; Slate Weekend Contests With Idaho Teams

The Nyssa Bulldogs have been on the losing end of their last three basketball games, being defeated by Vallivue, Ontario and Vale, in that order.

The NHS lads traveled to Vallivue last Friday night and tangled with a one-man ball club named Lon Klahr. The boys in blue and white trailed 12-15 at the end of the first quarter and were behind 28-38 at half-time. They picked up 14 counters in the third quarter to Vallivue's 13. When the final buzzer sounded, the scoreboard read 66-60 in favor of the Falcons.

John Moore led the Bulldog scoring with 19 points, followed by Paul Smit with 14 counters. Other scores were made by Terry Oft, 8; Dick Finger, Neal Bohannon and Tom Moore, 6 each; and Paul House, 1.

Statistically, the Nyssa lads completed 52 percent of their free shots, compared to 60 percent for the Falcons and were accurate in 36 percent of their floor attempts in comparison to 41 percent by the Idaho boys.

#### Lose by Narrow Margin

The Bulldogs hosted the Ontario Tigers Saturday evening and lost by a slim 3-point margin, the final tally being 54-49. John Moore and Oft accounted for 13 points each with other scores made by Smit, 10; Bohannon, 7; Finger, 4; and Mike Kodama, 2.

Nyssa's team led at the end of the first quarter and at the half

but were overcome during the last part of the game. In comparing statistics, the Bulldogs completed 39 percent of their floor shots and Ontario, 45 percent; were 50 percent accurate at the charity stripe and Ontario, 60 percent.

#### Vikings Top Bulldogs

Vale topped the NHS squad 43-31 Tuesday evening in a contest on the Vikings' court. Both clubs had a slow first quarter and Vale led 11-5 at the end of the stanza with the Bulldogs closing the margin to 25-21 at half-time. The local boys were limited to only three points during the third quarter with Vale picking up eight counters.

Smit led Nyssa's scoring with 13 points and other counters were made by Oft, 6; Brad Maxfield and Tom Moore, 5 each; and Kodama, 2.

The Bulldogs host the Emmett Huskies on Friday evening and the Meridian Warriors on Saturday night. Junior varsity games begin at 6:45 and varsity contests are scheduled to begin at 8 o'clock.
