

Bulldogs Score Win Over Savages; Lose to Vikings in District Contests

Nyssa earned a portion of the Greater Oregon Eastern sub-district title Saturday night when they defeated Enterprise 52-47 on the Savages' home court.

The Bulldogs leaped to a 15-9 first quarter lead and were never overtaken. The boys in blue and white were ahead 28-16 at halftime and 36-29 at the three-quarter mark.

Adrian Defeats Elgin In 8-B Tournament; Friday Game Slated

The Adrian Antelopes defeated Elgin 69-46 in the first round of the district 8-B basketball tournament held Tuesday evening at Baker. High scorers for the Antelopes were Ben Conklin with 24 points and Duane Munn, 22 counters.

Adrian will meet Halfway Friday night in the Baker senior high school gymnasium. Winner of this contest will go into the championship playoff Saturday night. In the other semi-final game, Wallowa will be pitted against Harper.

The teams winning Friday contests will play Saturday evening to determine first and second place winners and the losing squads will compete for third and fourth positions. The state tournament will be held March 10-12 at Pendleton.

Accounting for double figure scores were Neal Bohannon with 12 points, Terry Oft and Paul Smit with 11 counters each. Other Bulldog scores were earned by Gene Brown, 6; Brad Maxfield, John and Tom Moore, each with 4 points.

As a result of the Enterprise victory, Nyssa was forced into a playoff game with Vale which was held Monday night at the Ontario high school gymnasium. The Vikings assured themselves of a spot in the district tournament by edging the Bulldogs 30-46.

Nip-and-Tuck Contest

The Vale lads led 12-9 at the end of the first quarter but the Bulldogs fought back and evened the score at 22-all when the buzzer sounded at halftime. During the early minutes of the third period, it was a nip-and-tuck game with first one team and then the other scoring a basket.

The Vikings then began edging ahead and led 37-30 at the end of the third stanza.

John Moore and Terry Oft led the Bulldog scoring with 19 and 15 points, respectively. Smit and Bohannon accounted for 5 points each, while Maxfield and Tom Moore each added 1 point.

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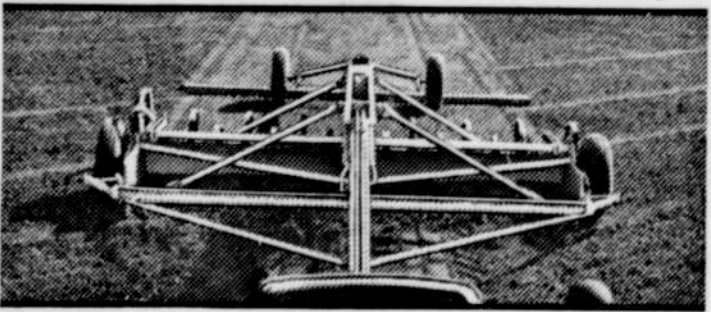
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
