Harlan Sager Among OSU Seniors Chosen For Nuclear Program

Harlan Sager is among five senior naval cadets at Oregon State university selected for training in the Navy's Nuclear Power program, according to an OSU news release.

The ROTC student, son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Sager of Nyssa, is a senior in the school of science at OSU.

The men were selected to apply for the special training due to high academic standings in science courses. Final selection was announced following recent personal interviews with Admiral H. G. Rickover in Washington, D.C.

After graduation and commissioning in June, the cadets will undergo 18 months of intensive study and training in nuclear power propulsion plans and submarine school. They will then be qualified for nuclear submarine duty.
