### Inspectors Condemn 56 Animals in Month

One in every 416 animals inspected at slaughter by the Oregon Department of Agriculture's meat inspectors was condemned in February.

Figures compiled by the department showed 24,101 animals slaughtered during the month and 56 condemned. Cattle led in the number of animals going to market with 12,147 and swine were second high with 10,708.

In addition to the whole animals that were rejected, the inspectors condemned 8,280 parts totaling 59,343 pounds. Livers accounted for over 85 percent of the parts condemned and for almost 90 percent of the overall weight of the rejected parts.
