

Juniors Display Bowling Ability With High Scores During Tourney

As recorded at the Sugar Bowl, results of the March 17-19 junior invitational tourney reveal that many of the young kegglers meant real "bowling business." The Treasure Valley youngsters were placed into three age groups — Preps, Juniors and Majors.

The results reflect 25 scratch games of 200-or-over rolled by the bowlers, with a 249 high recorded by Nysson Scott Engstrom of the Prep division.

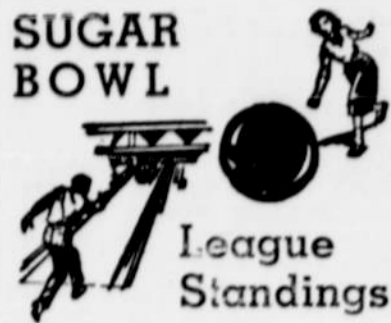
