

Weiser Captures First in Track Meet; Bulldogs Take 2nd; Bishop Kelly, 3rd

Bulldogs Defeat Wolverines 10-3; Lose 9-0 to Pirates

The NHS Bulldogs defeated Weiser 10-3 and bowed to the Payette Pirates 9-0 in diamond contests during the past week.

Nyssa traveled to Weiser last Friday afternoon for the first conference game of the season. The Wolverines scored three runs in the first two innings and held the Bulldogs scoreless until the fifth stanza when Ralph Estrada started a rally with a base hit and later scored on a wild pitch.

In the same inning, Dan Wilson connected for a base hit, scoring two more runs and tying up the ball game.

The Bulldogs added four more runs in the sixth, tallied three additional scores in the final period and held the Wolverines scoreless.

Brad Burningham took over pitching duties for Gary Mason in the second inning with the bases loaded, two men out and the score 2-0 in favor of Weiser. Brad walked the first batter; from then on he pitched a one-hit, shut-out ball game.

Ralph Leavitt led the Bulldog batting with two hits for three times at the plate. The Nyssa boys earned 10 runs on eight hits and one error, compared to three runs on four hits and six errors for Weiser.

Blanked by Payette
The Bulldogs suffered a 9-0 defeat at the hands of the Payette Pirates Tuesday afternoon on the Idaho diamond. Payette's ace pitcher, Warren Meador, fanned 12 Nyssa hitters and walked two men during the contest.

Meador aided his own cause with a home run; however, his teammates gained only five hits off two Bulldog pitchers.

Nyssa's league record now stands at 1-1. The Bulldogs travel to Ontario this afternoon and will go to Boise Saturday afternoon for a double header against the Eagles of Capital high.
