TO REMOVE MILDEW OR MOLD

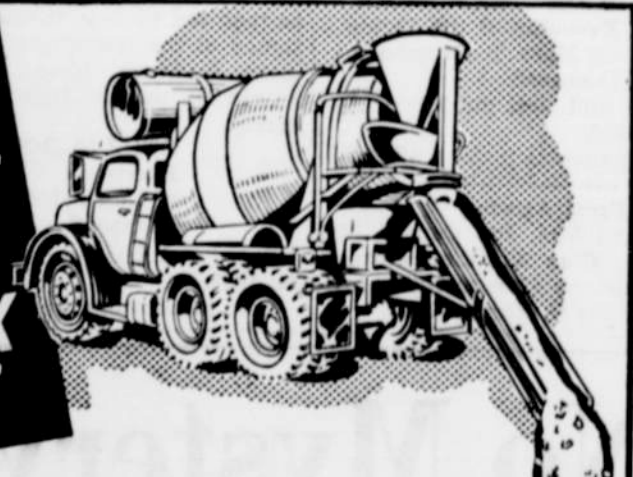

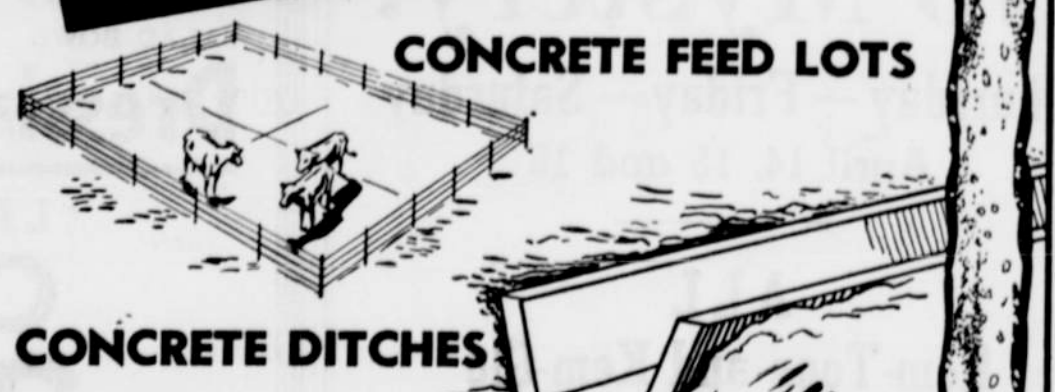
