

Baker Team Wins Third Consecutive Crown at Nyssa Invitational Meet

The Baker Bulldogs rolled up their third straight Nyssa invitational track crown last Saturday with 54½ points. Other teams finishing in order were Emmett with 24 points; Nyssa, 23; Weiser, 21½; Vale, 20½; Ontario 15½; Payette, 15; and Vallivue, 13.

The eight team field broke eight records and tied two others. Pat Miller of Weiser, running the best he has all year, won the mile run in 4:29.4, one second off the Idaho state record. Previous meet record for this distance was 4:39.5, set by Grant of Ontario in 1965.

NHS Bulldogs Defeat Bishop Kelly; Lose To Vallivue Falcons

The Bulldogs of Nyssa high shut out the Black Knights from Bishop Kelly by a 7-0 final tally last Friday afternoon on the Idaho diamond. The Knights had as many hits as the Bulldogs but could not keep up in scoring runs.
