Nyssa's baseball team downed the Emmett Huskies 8-5 on the home diamond Friday, April 28. The Bulldogs backed up Danny Wilson's four-hit pitching with 10 hits. Gary Berg and Gene Brown both hit triples to lead the offensive attack. Wilson managed seven strikeouts, compared to four for Madareta of Emmett.

Nyssa's nine scored one run in the first inning, three in the third, two in the fourth and another two in the fifth for a total of eight runs.

Emmett players crossed the plate twice in the third inning and three times in the seventh stanza for their five runs.

Nyssa committed four errors, compared to three for the Huskies of Idaho.
