Owyhee Chapel Rites Conducted Monday For Wren Hendricks

Funeral services for Wren Petty Hendricks were conducted on Monday afternoon, May 2, 1966, at Owyhee LDS ward chapel with Bishop Wayne Berrett presiding.

Mr. Hendricks succumbed the previous Thursday evening in Caldwell Memorial hospital following a lingering illness.

He was born Nov. 8, 1894, in Richmond, Utah, a son of Alma and Julia Vilate Petty Hendricks. On Sept. 20, 1916, he was united in marriage to Emma Blair in the Logan LDS temple. The couple resided in Utah and in 1929 they moved to the Nyssa area where Mr. Hendricks farmed until his retirement several years ago.

He was an active member of the LDS church, and his favorite hobby was fishing.
