Steve Petrie Sets Shot Put Record At La Grande Meet

Paced by Steve Petrie, Mark Ward and Scott Jeffries, Nyssa placed second in the Eastern Oregon Invitational Track meet held May 6 in La Grande.

Baker won the event with 65½ points, followed in order by Nyssa with 49½; Heppner, 41; La Grande, 41; Vale, 38; Ontario, 33; Mac-Hi, 12; and Enterprise, 3 points.

Petrie set a record in the shot put event with a heave of 52 feet, 5¼ inches, breaking the previous record of 48 feet, 8¼ inches set in 1962. He also won first in the discus throw with a toss of 151 feet, ¾ inch.

Ward took the long jump with a leap of 21 feet, 10 inches, and Jeffries won the 220-yard dash with a time of :23.5. The latter also placed third in the 180-yard low hurdles.

Other Nyssa points were added by the 880-yard relay team which placed second, while Cleaver and Talbot tied for fourth spot in the 100-yard dash.

Jensen placed fifth in the pole vault and Bob Smit tied for fourth place in the high jump and won third in the javelin throw. Larsen was fourth place winner in the long jump competition.
