Homer Schnell Succumbs of Apparent Attack; Rites Held at Elks Temple

Final services for J. Homer Schnell, Malheur county clerk, were conducted Monday afternoon, May 9, 1966, at the Elks temple in Ontario, with burial made in Evergreen cemetery. The rites were under direction of Bertelson - Lienkaemper funeral chapel of Ontario.

Mr. Schnell succumbed early Friday morning at his home in Ontario after suffering an apparent heart attack.

He was born Sept. 1, 1922, at Clovis, N.M. He resided at Home-dale, Idaho, until 1950 when he moved to Adrian and went to Vale in 1952, at which time he was employed by the Simplot company.

The deceased was elected Malheur county clerk in 1956 and at time of his death was serving his third term.

Mr. Schnell was an active member of BPOE No. 1690, Ontario, and had served as secretary of the lodge since 1963. He was chairman of the Elks state eye clinic and was also president of the Oregon Association of County Clerks and Records.

On June 19, 1965, he was married to Ocie Yeager Kawasoe in Ontario.
 In addition to his widow, he is survived by one son, Dennis Schnell; two daughters, Denice and Debora Schnell, all of Vale.
 Other survivors include his mother, Mrs. Homer Schnell of Filer, Idaho; a brother, Larry Schnell of Kent, Wash.; two sisters, Mrs. Edna Egner of San Francisco and Mrs. Hubert Hendrix of Twin Falls; two stepdaughters, Marcia and Marianne Kawasoe of Ontario.
