

Longtime Area Resident Succumbs; Tuesday Rites Held at Local Chapel

... Suffers Heart Ailment

Funeral services for Mrs. Ethel Florence Wilson were conducted Tuesday afternoon, May 24, 1966, at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating clergyman was Ralph A. Lawrence of Nyssa Methodist church.

Mrs. Wilson succumbed Saturday at Malheur Memorial hospital after suffering a heart ailment for several months.

She was born Sept. 5, 1893, at LaFayette, Ind., a daughter of Fred and Elizabeth Bradbury Powell. The family came to the Nyssa area 57 years ago. On Oct. 21, 1927, the deceased was married to Aden Wilson at Payette.

Mrs. Wilson was fond of flowers, working in her yard and one of her favorite pastimes was taking camping and fishing trips.

In addition to Mr. Wilson of the home at 429 North Third street in Nyssa, she is survived by a brother, Earl Powell of Boise. Her parents, two brothers and a sister preceded her in death.

Interment was made in the Nyssa cemetery. Active pallbearers were Dale Garrison, Howard Day, Bob Thompson, John Broad, Harry Gahan, Wilbur Holcomb.

Nyssa Chapel Rites Conducted Tuesday For V. Lynn Kygar

Funeral rites for Verner Lynn Kygar were held Tuesday morning, May 24, 1966, at Lienkaemper chapel in Nyssa. Officiating minister was Arthur Skogan of Owyhee Community church.

Mr. Kygar succumbed Saturday after suffering with cancer for the past two years.

He was born July 22, 1900, at Ponca City, Okla., a son of Jesse Wilson and Florence Ritchey Kygar. The family came to the Nyssa area in 1915, and on Dec. 26, 1923, the deceased married Charlotte Huffman at Caldwell, Idaho.

Mr. Kygar was a farmer and rancher at Nyssa and Rome, Ore., and served as a member of the Owyhee school board for six years. According to members of his family and close friends, he will always be remembered for his sense of humor, and he remained cheerful until time of his death.

In addition to his widow, he is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Grace Charlotte Brown, Mrs. Della Lea Franklin and Mrs. Maxine Karen Prettyman, all of Boise.

Also surviving are four brothers, John Keith, Earl and Merl Kygar of Nyssa and William Kenneth Kygar of Tule Lake, Calif.; one sister, Mrs. Gladys DeGoede of Sun City, Ariz.; 11 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Jesse Everett in April 1948; his father in February 1952 and his mother in March 1966.

Interment was made in Owyhee cemetery under direction of Lienkaemper funeral home. Pallbearers were Robert Dowell of Jordan Valley, Ray Cantrell of Boise, Charlie Culbertson, Jim Hite, Werner and William Peutz of Nyssa.
