### OSU Bulletin Gives Insect Control Tips

Control of vegetable garden insects and safe use of pesticides are featured in a newly revised Oregon State university bulletin.

The publication, "Vegetable Garden Insect Pests," was prepared for home gardeners or small-acreage growers. Robert Every, OSU extension entomologist, and H. H. Crowell and H. E. Morrison of the OSU Entomology department, prepared the publication.

Included are recommended concentrations of common insecticides for use in small quantities and usual intervals between the last application of insecticides and harvest to avoid excessive residues.

Insects and the damage they cause are described and pictured. Suggested controls accompany the list.

All materials recommended in the publication for use in home gardens are available in small packages at seed or garden supply stores.

Copies of the bulletin are available free from county extension agents or from the OSU bulletin clerk.
