WHITE POLYESTER BLOUSES AND SHIRTS

... tend to yellow with age. But there are some solutions. These fibers have a high affinity for oily soil and will gradually yellow if not thoroughly laundered between each wearing. (Three jiggles in a wash basin aren't enough. Use the washer.)

Try one of the blue liquid all-purpose detergents. These have built-in brighteners which are especially effective on polyesters. Also, use a chlorine bleach.

A color remover will help restore whiteness to a yellowed polyester or a blend of polyester and cotton. You can get this product at a drug, variety or grocery store.

DO YOU KNOW THAT ACCIDENTS KILL TWO MALES

... to every female? Also, accidents are the highest ranking cause of death from the age of 1 through 34 years.

Check up on yourself and follow these safety tips. Turn handles of pans inward on the range. Wipe up liquids or grease spilled on the floor. Keep household cleaning aids where children can't reach them.

Store sharp objects away from blunt ones. Be sure that smokers use large enough ash trays and check the match to see that it's out. Of course, don't smoke in bed. If you're carrying a large bundle, make certain you can see ahead.

PERMANENT PRESS

... or durable press garments have really come into their own. Some say they lose color along the edges of seams.

This was true of some of the first garments produced, but has been corrected for the most part.

To counter this problem, turn clothes inside out before washing. This will cut down on the friction in these areas.

WANT A TABLE TOP

... that's child-proof, pet-proof and husband-proof? Mrs. Dorothy Brown, Extension home furnishings specialist at Oregon State university, told us about a new type of wood furniture which comes pretty close to that.

It's made by wrapping core stock with a sheet of thin wood veneer which is protected on the outer surface by vinyl film and on the inner surface by aluminum foil.

The vinyl simplifies maintenance, while foil prevents warping and resistance to heat.
