## Former Nyssan Dies In Portland; Local Rites Held Monday

Graveside services for Mrs. Leila Thompson, wife of Nyssa's first postmaster, were conducted Monday morning, June 6, 1966, at the local cemetery. Officiating minister was the Rev. Ralph A. Lawrence of Nyssa Methodist church.

Mrs. Thompson succumbed Friday in Portland. She was born Nov. 4, 1871, in Knoxville, Ark., and came to Nyssa with her family in April 1906.

The Thompsons' daughter, Elizabeth, became Nyssa's first postmistress in 1912 and held that position until 1930 when the family moved to Portland.

Mrs. Thompson was preceded in death by her husband, Samuel H. Thompson, in 1916.

In addition to her daughter, Elizabeth, the deceased is survived by two sons, Norvell of Molalla, Ore., and Charley D. Thompson of Vancouver, Wash.; two other daughters, Mrs. Levi (Dora) Eldridge of Pilot Rock, Ore., Mrs. H. R. (Virginia) Foran of Portland.

## Motorcycle Riders Reminded of License Law Effective July 1

Less than a month remains for Oregon's motorcycle riders to obtain a "motorcycle endorsement" on their driver licenses or face the possibility of citation for operating illegally.

A new law, passed by the 1965 legislature, is scheduled to take effect July 1. It requires operators of the two-wheeled vehicles to be fully licensed drivers, as well as demonstrate ability to ride a cycle for Department of Motor Vehicle examiners.

At the same time, it will become illegal to rent, lease or otherwise furnish a motorcycle to anyone who has not first displayed a license with a motorcycle endorsement.

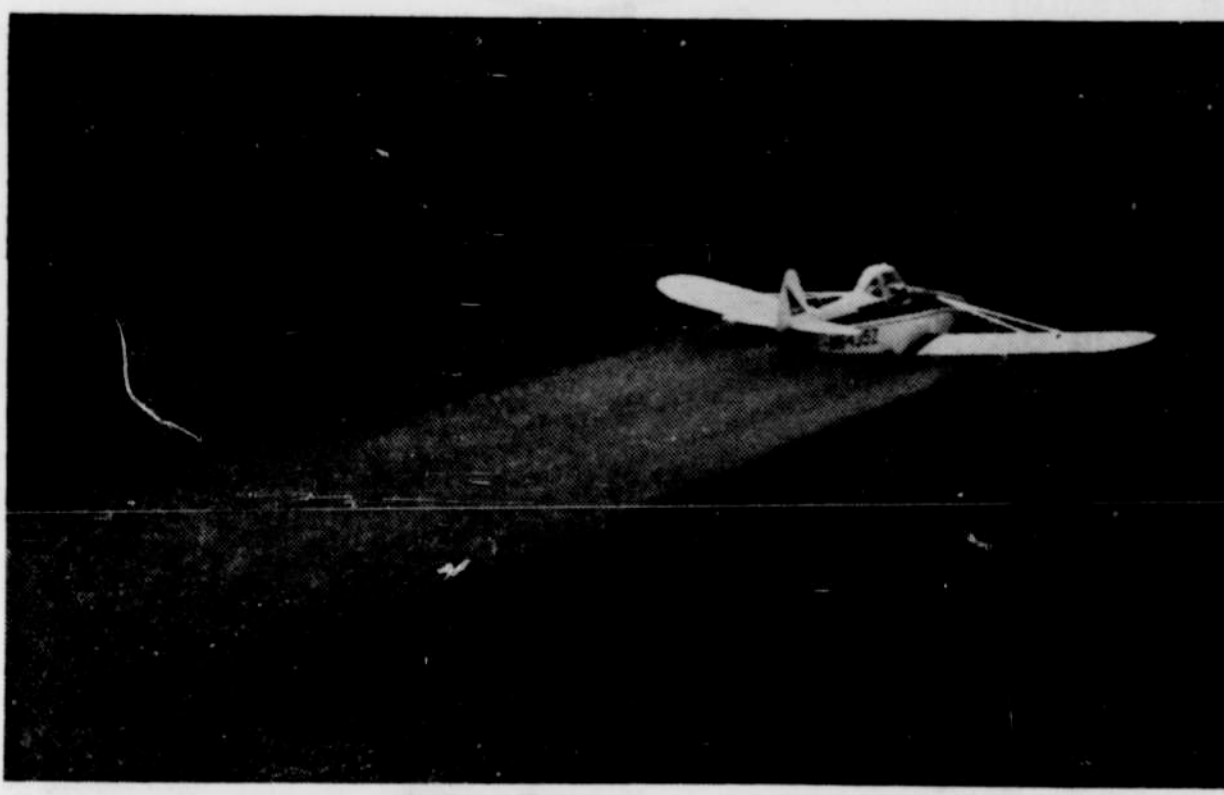

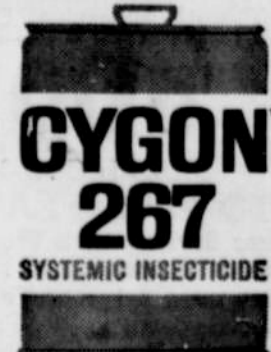
