NEW COOKS AS WELL AS EXPERIENCED ONES

A minute timer may be a handy helper. Set it to remind you to reduce the heat under a vegetable, when to take out a three-minute egg, the time to make a phone call and so on.

If you want to chill a can of fruit juice in a hurry, put it in the freezer. Then set the minute timer for 20 minutes. When the gong sounds, take out the juice before it freezes.

WHEN YOU TRY YOUR HAND AT PAPER HANGING
