dry-land agriculture of Oregon and for many irrigated areas served by direct diversion from streams because of continued lack of precipitation, complicated by colder-than-usual winds.

Stored water will "save the day" for most lands served from reservoirs.

Next official report on water supply conditions in Oregon will be issued early in October at the close of the current irrigation season.

Funeral services for Joe Henry Wright, father of Mrs. Ron (Mary) Rookstool, will be conducted at 11 o'clock this morning, June 16, 1966, at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating minister will be the Rev. Ralph A. Lawrence of Nyssa Methodist church.

Mr. Wright succumbed Monday morning after suffering with cancer for approximately one year.

He was born March 8, 1904, in Oklahoma and on May 28, 1927, he was united in marriage to Trixie Duncan at Konawa, Okla. The deceased was a farm laborer and the family resided in Arizona for 20 years before going to Idaho in 1959.

Traffic volume on most of Oregon's highways showed a general increase for April 1966, compared to April 1965, according to a report compiled by the Oregon State Highway department.

A summary of the permanent traffic recorder data for rural and urban highways shows a 9.0 percent increase in vehicular traffic for April 1966 compared to that month in 1965.
