Oregon Tax Director Notes Credit Claim On Gasoline Revenue

A. G. Erickson, district director of Internal Revenue for Oregon, announced this week that Form 2240, Claim for Refund of Federal Tax on Gasoline Used on a Farm, has been discontinued for 1966, which covers the period July 1, 1965, through June 30, 1966.

Erickson said the law now provides that for taxable years beginning after June 30, 1965, the federal tax paid on gasoline should be claimed as a credit on federal income tax returns. Instructions for claiming the credit will be included in the income tax booklet which will be mailed with the tax return for 1966.

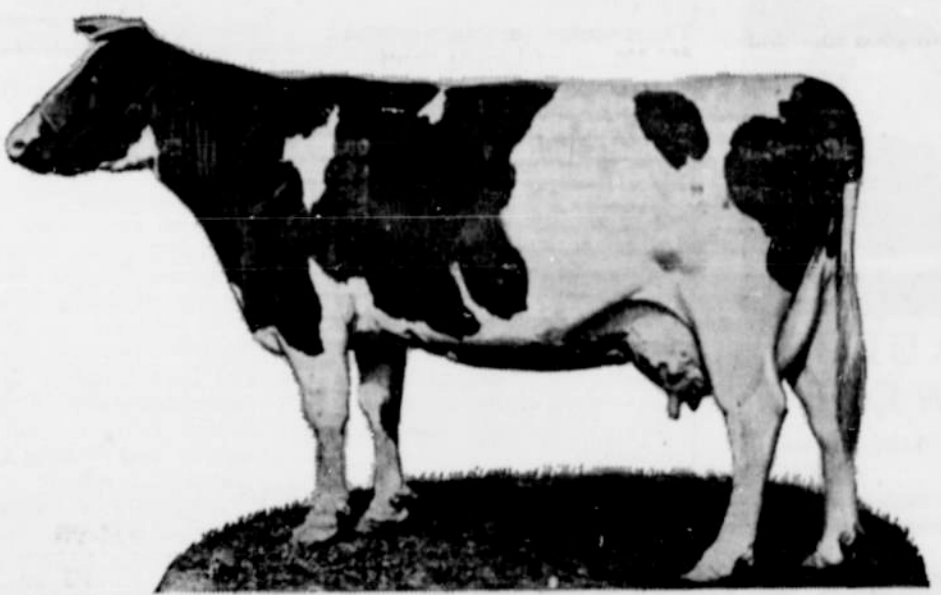
