MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF MALHEUR COUNTY COURT — APRIL 13, 1966
 Called to Order by Judge Ellis A. White with Commissioners Jacob Fischer and Earl Flock present.

The County Court adopted the resolution that Mr. Neifert contact the Parma Water Lifter Company for a sprinkler system for the Nursing Home, with the cost approximately \$1500.00, to be paid monthly with no interest.

The County Court approved the resolution of a letter to Mr. Ross Butler of the Ore-Ida Company requesting maps of roads to be needed in the Pumping Project north of Ontario.

The resolution was approved that Earl Flock and Jake Fischer present to the Interim Committee Hearing on Mental Health to be held in Enterprise, requesting the state to increase the aid from 50% to 75% for counties with a Mental Health Program.

The County Court approved the resolution of the installation of a telephone cable as requested by the Idaho Telephone Company, with the stipulation that the cable be buried at 30 inches and the company to relocate cable at their own expense in case of road improvements by the county.

The County Court adopted the resolution to purchase and install a car radio for use of the Juvenile Department.

The County Court accepted the offer of Sheriff Robert G. Ingram on the usage of a half-acre of ground to provide a garden for the Jail and Nursing Home, and to be cared for by the Trustees of the Jail. The County will bear the cost of digging a well deeper and installing a pump with the estimated cost of \$500.00.

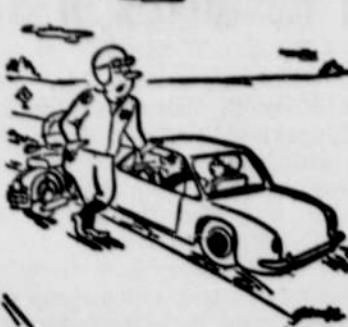
The County Court adopted a resolution to close the County Road in Sec. 35, T. 18 S., R. 44 E., in the S. E. corner.

Servicemen Disabled In Vietnam Conflict Get License Discount

Oregon veterans of the Vietnam conflict who are disabled to the extent of 25 percent or more are eligible to purchase hunting and fishing licenses at reduced rates, according to a recent report from the Oregon Game commission.

Phil Schneider, state game director, advised that this determination was made following some question as to the eligibility of Vietnam veterans. Not specifically listed under the law, it was ruled that veterans of the Vietnam conflict who received either the Vietnam medal or Expeditionary Force medal are eligible. Veterans in the latter group are listed under the law.

Schneider said that Vietnam veterans who can present a letter certifying them as 25 percent or more disabled and who can display their discharge papers will be entitled to purchase hunting and fishing licenses for a fee of 50 cents each.
