

Big Game Synopsis Delayed; Closing, Drawing Dates Set for Tags, Permits

Oregon hunters are advised that because of a delay in letting the contract, big game regulations in synopsis form will not be available for distribution until three weeks or more.

Phil Schneider, state game director, said that several complications developed which will result in a delay of the printing. He said regulations in synopsis form are not expected to be received from the printers now until late June or early July.

In the meantime, the game commission will try by all

means to keep hunters informed on season dates, unit or controlled season filing procedures and other information pertaining to the hunts.

License dealers have been provided with summary sheets of the regulations so that hunters can look them over before filing for permits or controlled tags. Dealers also have application forms and big game tags for distribution.

Closing, Drawing Dates Given

Closing date for antelope, goat, sheep and controlled season deer tags is July 20 at 5 p.m. and drawing date is July 26 at 10 a.m.; unit deer permits, 5 p.m. Aug. 3 and drawing will be held at 10 a.m. Aug. 9. Closing date for elk permits is 5 p.m. Aug. 23 with drawing time slated for 10 a.m. Aug. 30.

Persons desiring to apply for a tag for antelope, sheep, goats or a controlled deer season should apply on a "Controlled Season Tag Application" which is available at all license agencies.

The species and area preferred, the name, address and license number of the applicant must be legibly printed in the provided spaces.

Tag fee of \$5 shall be submitted (by check or money order) with each application for controlled season deer and antelope tags. The \$10 fee for sheep or goat tags will be collected from the successful applicants after the drawing. (Do not submit fee with sheep or goat tag applications.)

Rules Listed for Applying

Applications for deer or elk permits should be made on a "Permit Application" which is issued with the general deer or elk tag and bears the identical serial number.

Name and address of the applicant and his choice of unit or area must be legibly printed in the provided spaces.

Persons desiring to apply as a party of not to exceed two for antelope or elk or not to exceed four for deer may fasten their individual applications together. Party applications exceeding the above maximums will be entered individually.

Eligible Persons Defined

Only resident licensed hunters may apply for tags.

Persons receiving an antelope tag after 1961 are not eligible to apply for a 1966 antelope tag.

Persons receiving an antlerless elk permit after 1962 are not eligible to apply for a 1966 elk permit.

No person may receive more than one sheep or goat tag in a lifetime.

No person is eligible to receive more than one controlled season deer tag in 1966.

Superintendent Glenn Ward of Adrian schools reports there is still need of a third grade teacher. He also stated that the building project is progressing as scheduled.

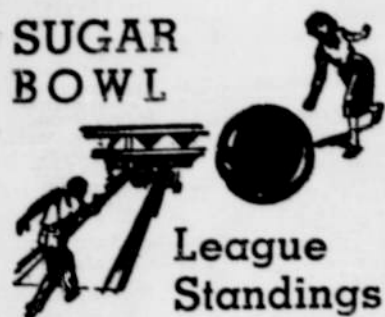
