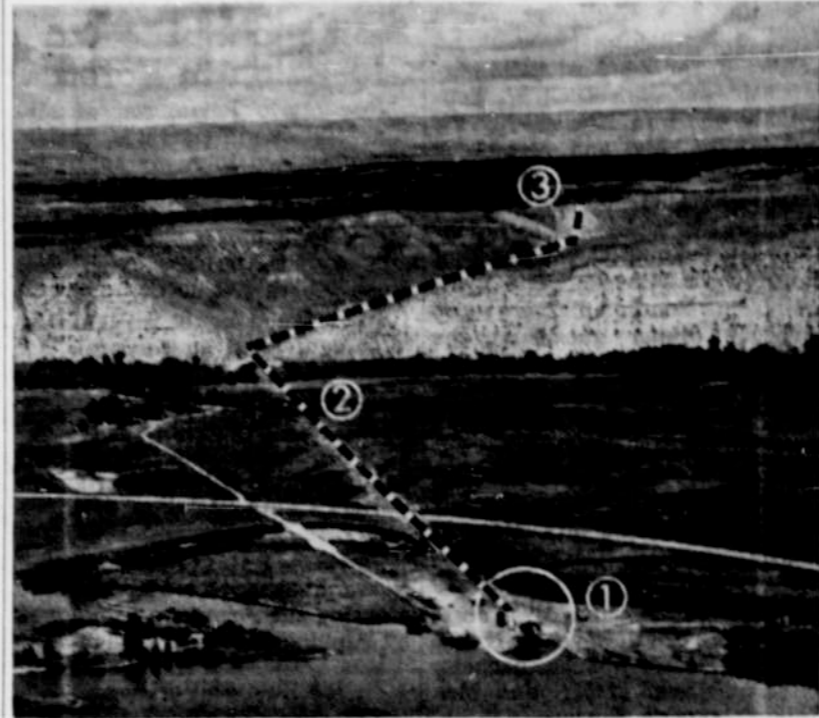

A PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE and dedication ceremony will be held next Tuesday at this new high-lift irrigation project near Payette featuring two 1,500-horsepower electric pumps that are the nation's largest on a privately financed development. The event is scheduled to begin at 2 p.m. under joint sponsorship of Payette Farm company, a division of J. R. Simplot company, and Idaho Power company. The project is one of numerous new electric-pump undertakings that are expected to bring at least 50,000 additional acres under cultivation in southern Idaho and eastern Oregon this season and further boost the total of more than 1 million acres developed by private enterprise in the last 20 years alone. As seen in this aerial photo, the Payette Farm project includes a pumping plant (1) that lifts Payette river water 440 feet through a 42-inch penstock (2) to an initial 2,500 acres of farmland (3) atop a high plateau. It will be expanded to a total of 4,300 acres with installation of two additional 1,500-horsepower pumps next season.
