MOST TYPES OF PLASTIC

... such as rain boots, garment bags and the like, melt when in contact with high heat. Several people have asked us how to remove melted plastic from a gas heater or other hot object such as an iron.

The chemistry department at Oregon State university suggests that the gas heater, including its pilot light, be turned off. When it cools, scrape off as much plastic as possible. Then sponge repeatedly with nail polish remover or acetone. This liquid is flammable, so the heater must be cool.

The same procedure can be used for plastic melted on an iron.
