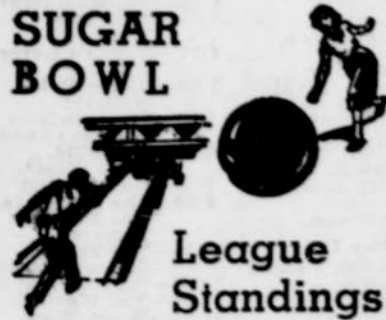


Nyssa Lads Take Three More Wins; Final Tourney Game to Be Replayed

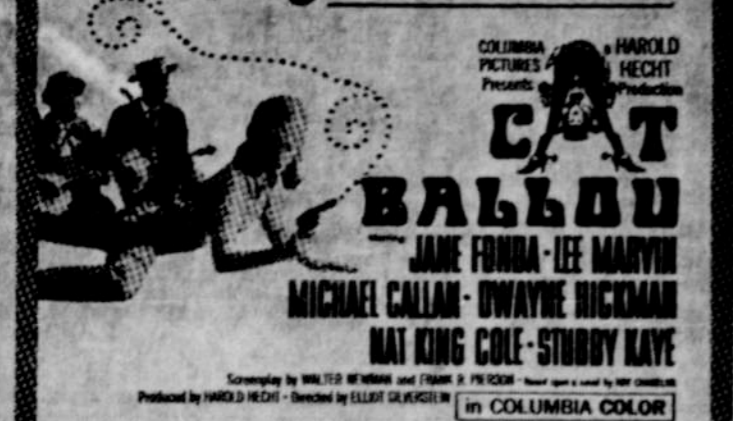
