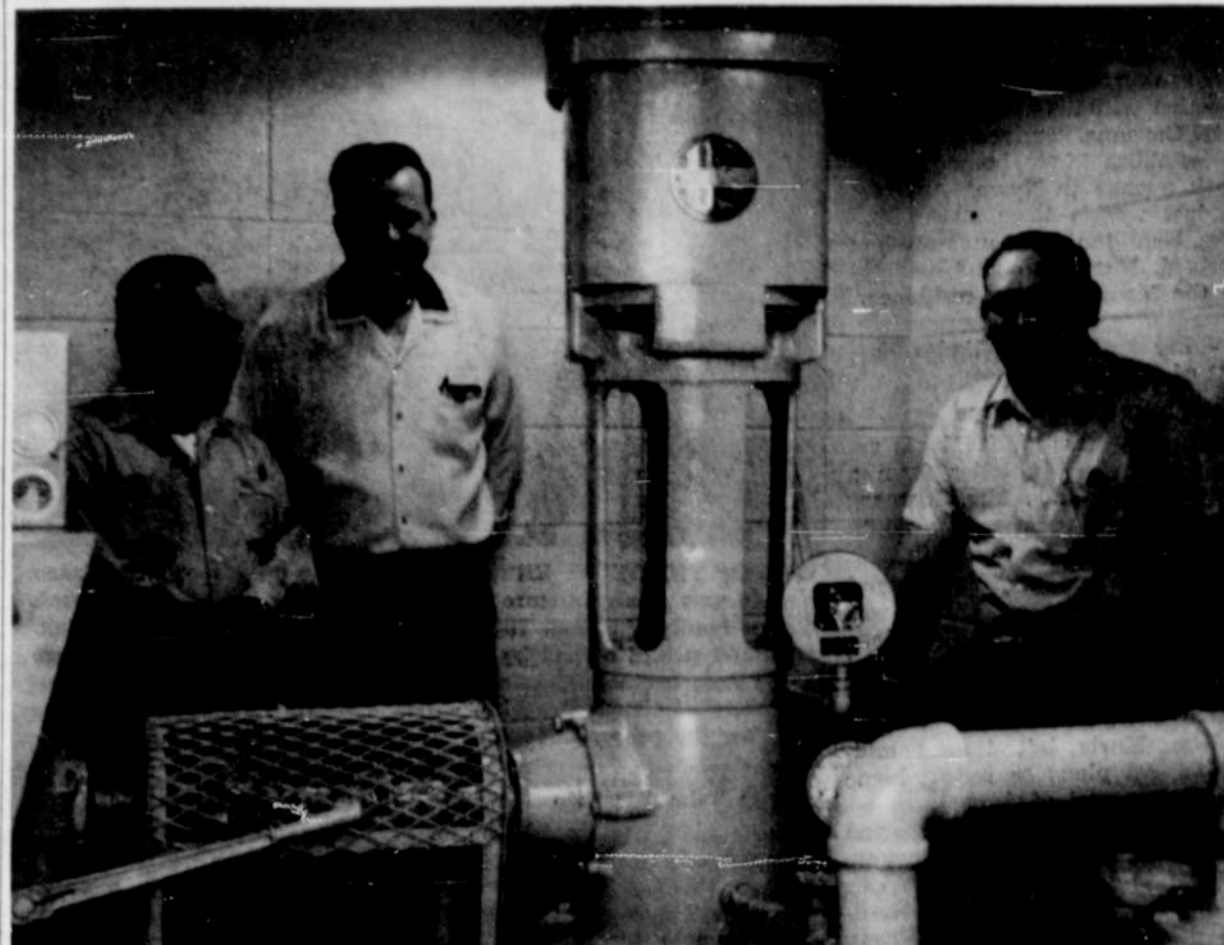

Books on Problems of Modern Living Now Available at Malheur Library

New books going into circulation Saturday, July 16, at Malheur county library in Ontario include the following.

"Crisis in Our Cities" by Lewis Herber. A discussion of the hazards brought about by air and water pollution as well as stress in urban environments.

"Black Man's Burden" by James Oliver Killens. The author mines no words in illustrating the many obvious or subtle ways in which Negroes accept the false image whites continue to project on them. This is an impassioned but basically constructive plea for genuine dialogue between the races.

"The New Matriarchy" by Evelyn Acworth. This book traces the history of women through the ages and the changing concepts of matriarchy and patriarchy.

"Our Space Environment" by Phillip D. Stern. A compact history of astronomy and description of the universe as known to modern science.

"Manned Space Flight" by Maxime Allan Faget. After a concise general review of the space program and its objectives, the author discusses specific problems of space flight.

"The Great Boom and Panic" by Robert T. Patterson. An informal history of the stock market and the men behind it in the tumultuous 1920's.

"The Galloping Gospel" by Angus H. MacLean. A personal story set against the background of the raw Canadian plains of half a century ago.

"A Second Chance" by Vian Smith. The story of a lad and a horse.
