Warning Sounded For Clear Title In Animal Buying

Don't take for granted that you have clear title on the animal you purchase. Be sure you have it.

K. W. Sawyer, assistant state director of agriculture for livestock services, has that advice for all who purchase animals after rendering a decision recently on the rightful owner of a cow consigned for sale at a livestock auction market.

The animal was among 60 head purchased some six months previously by the person consigning it for sale, but the brand inspection certificate he received at time of purchase failed to show purchase of the animal branded on the right hip with P9.

State Impounds Money
When the animal was later consigned for sale, clear title was questioned because of the brand, which was recorded to a man at The Dalles and the money impounded by the state.
