

### Fifty-Year Nyssa Resident Succumbs Following Stroke; Chapel Rites Held



MRS. ADA GARRISON  
... Dies at Age 83

Funeral services for Mrs. Ada Garrison were conducted at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning, July 26, 1966, at Lienkaemper chapel in Nyssa. Officiating was the Rev. Armand Larive of St. Paul's Episcopal church.

Mrs. Garrison succumbed Saturday afternoon at Malheur Memorial hospital after suffering a stroke on the previous Thursday morning. She had been in failing health for some time.

She was born Oct. 6, 1882, at Abilene, Kan., a daughter of John Franklin and Amanda Elizabeth Face Freeman; and on Aug. 27, 1902, was married to Charles Garrison.

After their marriage they resided in Kansas, later moved to Colorado and in 1916 came to the Nyssa area. Mr. Garrison succumbed Oct. 27, 1957 in Nyssa.

Mrs. Garrison was a member of the Methodist church, and until the past several years was active in work of the church and its affiliated organizations. Her favorite hobby was flower gardening.

She is survived by three sons, Louis of Grants Pass, Ore., Ray of Klamath Falls, Ore. (temporarily residing in Lima, Peru) and Dale Garrison of Nyssa; two daughters, Mrs. Charles (Gladys) Newbill of Adrian and Mrs. John (Vera) Olsen of Nyssa.

Also surviving are nine grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren. In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by her parents, one brother and eight sisters.

Interment was made in Nyssa cemetery under direction of Lienkaemper chapel. Active pallbearers were Artie Robertson, Harry Miner, M. C. Zamora, Bob Thompson, E. H. (Shorty) Brandt and Tom Eldredge.

The young soldier told his parents that he had contracted pneumonia since his hospitalization and also that a fungus growth and parasites had kept his injury from healing as it should.

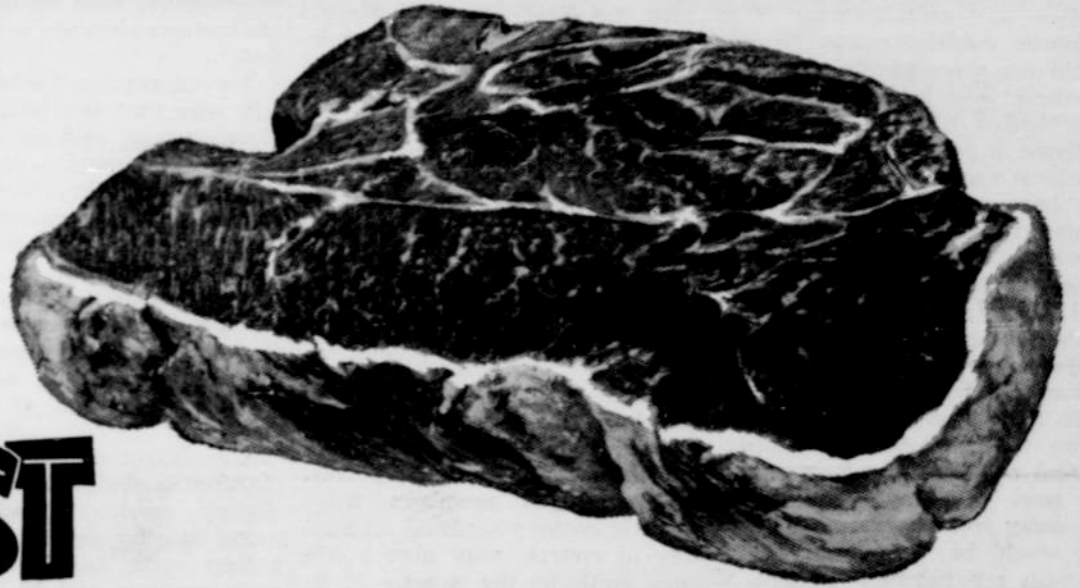
Richard suffered hip wounds on June 25 while he was on duty in Vietnam.
