**LETTER To the Editor**

Somewhere, U. S. A.  
 July 16, 1966

Dear Ted and Other Nyssans:  
 I thought maybe the citizens of Nyssa might like to hear about some of the adventures of a local banjo player. And even if the citizens don't care—you might need some copy, so here's a bit of filler.

A piano-playing friend, whom I met at the College of Idaho, and I decided to see the United States before our numbers came up for a South Vietnam pleasure tour.

We made no definite plans, the idea being to see as much of our country without being in so much of a hurry as to spread ourselves on a truck bumper.

My buddy, Jim Trousen from Wendell, Idaho, and I worked up a little act of about 45 minutes in length . . . complete with straw hats, spats, corny jokes and old-time music.

**Perform at Various Stops**  
 The most we hoped for was to be able to play and earn enough to pay for our suppers along the way. Fortunately, the "Show-Biz Gods" shown favorably upon us. We played in Jackson, Wyo., for two nights, at Old Faithful Inn for three nights; and then at the

Gilded Garter in Central City, Colo., we were offered a month's engagement.

Being a couple of small-town boys, we felt pretty good about this but decided to play a few nights only, as we wanted to see the rest of the states.

We pushed on, spending some nights in the car, some with relatives and friends. We stopped and played in Kansas City, St. Louis, Chicago, Cleveland, Niagara Falls, Montreal, Bar Harbor (Maine), Boston, New York, Washington, D.C., Richmond (Va.) and now we're headed for Memphis.

**Mosquitoes Draw Blood**

I'm happy to say that the only ones who haven't treated us hospitably are the mosquitoes. I'm afraid the Red Cross won't be getting their pint from us this year.

We saw the Broadway play, "Funny Girl," while in New York. It was truly a highlight of this safari.

I think what has amazed us most about the east is the racial tension. Being from a comparatively serene area, in this respect, we were both astounded and a little apprehensive at times.

More than once we were assailed with remarks while passing through cities and towns.

When going through a section on the west side of Chicago, we nearly became involved in a full-scale race riot. We can't help but wonder what the next few weeks in the deep south will bring.

**Nyssa "Finest Place"**

Residents of Nyssa: "You should indeed feel proud and lucky that you live in one of the finest little places in the U.S."

We all tend to take for granted the people and places in our environment. After seeing how some of the rest of our nation's people live, I'm grateful!

I can say my home is in a little town called Nyssa, on the Snake river at the eastern edge of Oregon.

We'll soon be in Memphis, so I'll seal this up, hall a pony express rider and hope this letter makes it back to the wild west.
