

Military Services Conducted July 30 At Nyssa for North Board Employee

An apparent cerebral hemorrhage claimed the life of William Stephen Weeks, 42, early last Thursday morning. He succumbed in Malheur Memorial hospital where he was admitted following the sudden attack.

Mr. Weeks, a 30-year resident of Nyssa, was born Jan. 29, 1924, at Bristol, Colo., a son of Thomas Stephen and Anna Blanche Farr Weeks.

He attended elementary school in Russell county, Kan., as well as both grade and high schools in Nyssa.

On Feb. 14, 1942, he was married to Willa Fern Rogers at Parma, Idaho. Mr. Weeks was inducted into the U.S. Army on May 28, 1943, and during World War II served as an anti-aircraft machine gunner. For approximately one year and seven months he was stationed in the Central European area.

For his army service he received the American theater service, European-African middle eastern service, victory and good conduct medals.

The deceased received his honorable discharge on March 24, 1946, and shortly after returning home began working for the Bureau of Reclamation and continued as operating engineer for the North Board of Control, headquartered in Nyssa.

Willie was a member of the Methodist church; and his favorite hobbies were fishing, hunting and collecting arrowheads.

In addition to his widow he is survived by a daughter, Sandra Kaye Weeks, 19, a student at Kinman Business university in Spokane; and one son, Denzel Stephen Weeks, 16, of the home.

Other survivors include his mother of Nyssa; three brothers, John H. of Seneca, Ore., Duane O. of Milwaukie, Ore., and Glen E. Weeks of Parma; three sisters, Mrs. Irene Van Zelf of Nyssa, Mrs. Betty J. Johnson of Parma and Mrs. Lola F. Steinkne of Vale. His father succumbed Feb. 16, 1966, at Nyssa.

Services were conducted Saturday afternoon, July 30, 1966, at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating was the Rev. Ralph A. Lawrence of Nyssa Methodist church. Soloist Clint Bellows sang "Be Still My Soul."

Interment was made in the Nyssa cemetery where military services were conducted by members of American Legion Post 79, Nyssa.
