Coaching Staff At TVCC Plans Grid Formation

With the initial date for football practice less than a month away, TVCC Football Coach Larry Stevens and his staff have formed basic offense and defensive plans for the coming season, according to a college news release.

Stevens, basically a multiple-offense coach, plans to start with very few plays offensively and concentrate heavily on execution. As he says, "It is better, in my opinion, to run a few plays well than many plays poorly."

The Chukars will feature an unbalanced offensive line with a split end both right and left. The backs will be mostly in the standard "T" formation but will be flanked occasionally.

In the past, Stevens' teams have been known to favor the running game. However, a rollout passing attack will be an important part of the Chukar offense.

Played at Oregon State

The coach, a Tommy Prothro disciple, having played for him at OSU, believes in strict application of game fundamentals. As he stated recently, "Plays, formation and personnel change every season but blocking and tackling are the constants that really determine winning or losing."

Stevens emphasized that all positions are open and that every man turning out will receive an equal chance to make the starting platoons, offensively and defensively.

The Chukar head coach anticipates a spirited turnout. Equipment will be issued Aug. 29-31, with Sept. 1 set as date for beginning of double-session practices.

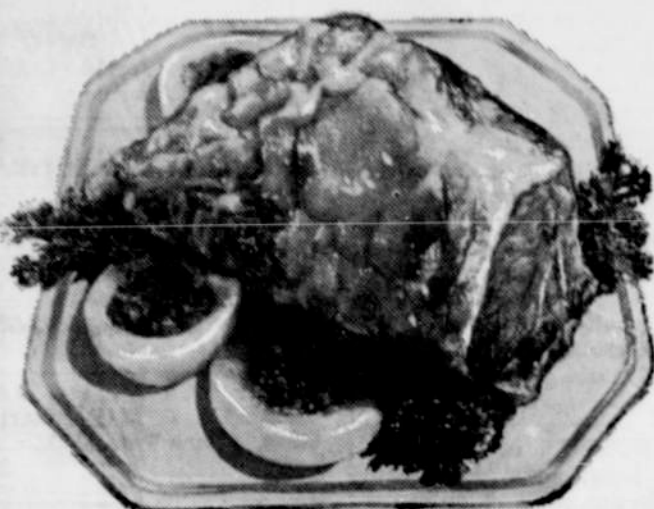

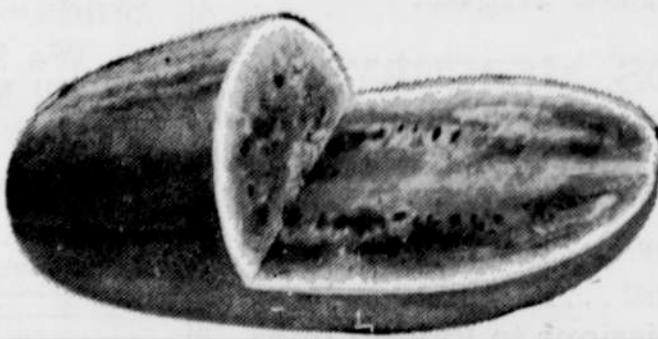
