

Stroke Claims Life of Naturopathic Masseuse; Nyssa Chapel Rites Held



CORA V. STOCKFLETH
... Dies at Age 89

Funeral services for Mrs. Cora V. Stockfleth were conducted Monday afternoon, Aug. 8, 1966, at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating minister was Ralph A. Lawrence of Nyssa Methodist church. Interment was made at Newell, S. D.

Mrs. Stockfleth succumbed Friday morning at Malheur Memorial hospital after suffering a recent stroke. She was born March 18, 1877, at Fairbault, Minn., a daughter of Harvey and Sarah Clark Landers. As a small child, she moved with her parents to Spirit Lake, Iowa, and in 1884 the family went to the Black Hills of South Dakota. The deceased attended schools at Rapid City.

On Jan. 22, 1895, she was married to Nicholas A. Viken and the couple homesteaded in 1905 near Newell. Mr. Viken succumbed in 1935.

The deceased had been a resident of Treasure Valley since she moved to Boise in 1939. On Jan. 10, 1942, she married George Stockfleth and the couple soon moved to Nampa where Mrs. Stockfleth was a practicing naturopathic masseuse.

They later went to Payette and in 1961 came to Nyssa where Mrs. Stockfleth continued her practice until time of her recent illness.

She was a member of the Methodist church and her favorite hobbies were hunting rocks, making sea moss pictures, crocheting rugs and making necktie bedspreads. By family and close friends she was known as a person who never met a stranger.

In addition to Mr. Stockfleth, survivors include seven sons, Howard Viken of Anchorage, Alaska, Floyd Viken of Eugene, Ore., Kenneth and Julius Viken of Newell, Fred and Delbert Palmer, Alaska.

Also surviving are two daughters, Mrs. L. E. (Inga) Robbins of Nyssa and Mrs. Marie Gardner of Sheridan, Wyo.; a brother, Ray Landers of Portland; one sister, Mrs. Edna Peterson of Long Beach, Calif.

Also surviving are 18 grandchildren, 44 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

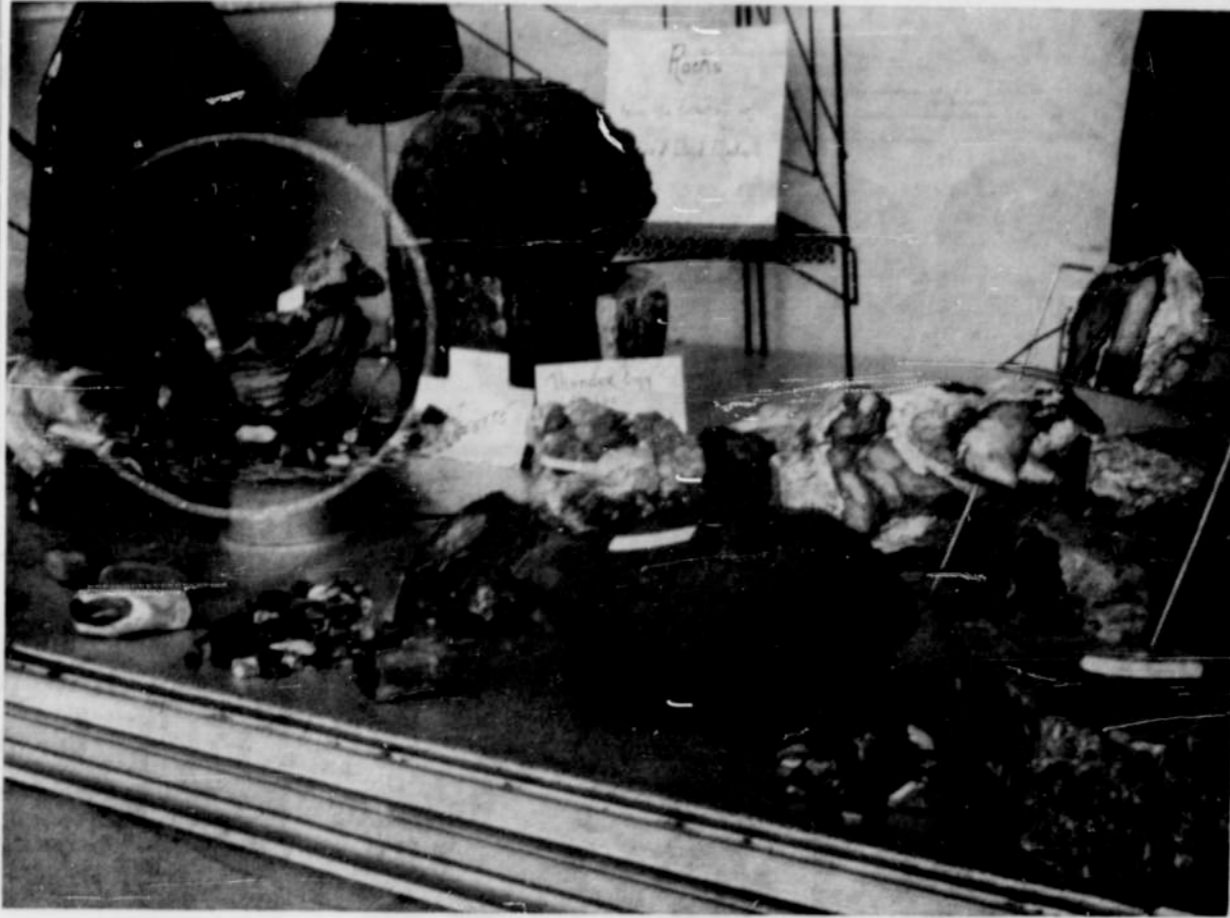
