Malheur City and the cemetery markers had been destroyed by fire years ago, but the graveyard has been renovated. Replicas of tree stumps mark the graves of Woodmen of the World and the American flag flies proudly. Mrs. Cook noted that the last burial made in the cemetery was the latter part of 1965 when the body of a Vale resident, Mr. Woodcock, was interred. After eating their lunch in the shadow of an old building, the Nyssa women then drove to Dooly mountain where they were given permission to visit the radar station. From there they could see several lakes, as well as La Grande, Huntington and other towns. Mrs. Cook stated that she had never seen lovelier scenery anywhere. After visiting Mrs. Nettie Cook and family in Baker, the trio stopped at Farewell Bend for another outdoor meal and arrived home late Sunday evening.—Staff Photo.

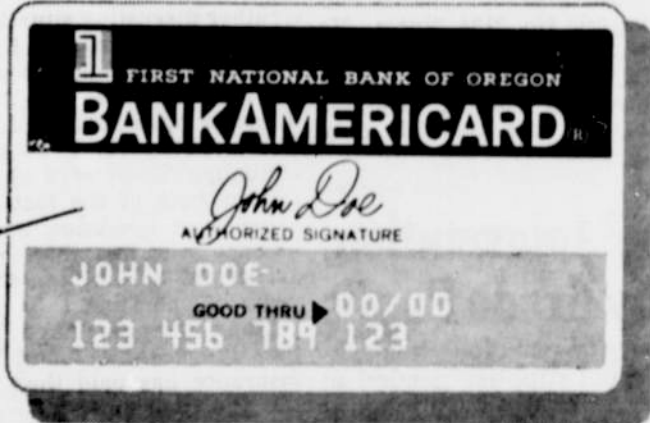
