Mrs. Stephens planned to leave Wednesday evening to return to her home in California.

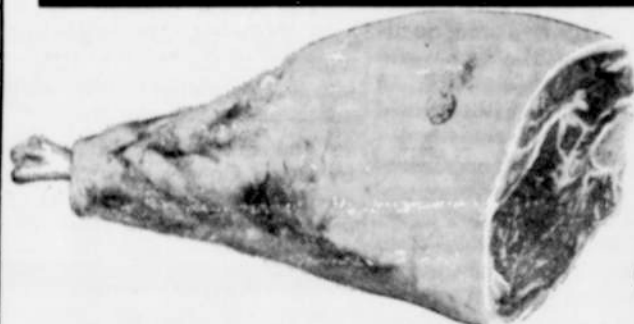
