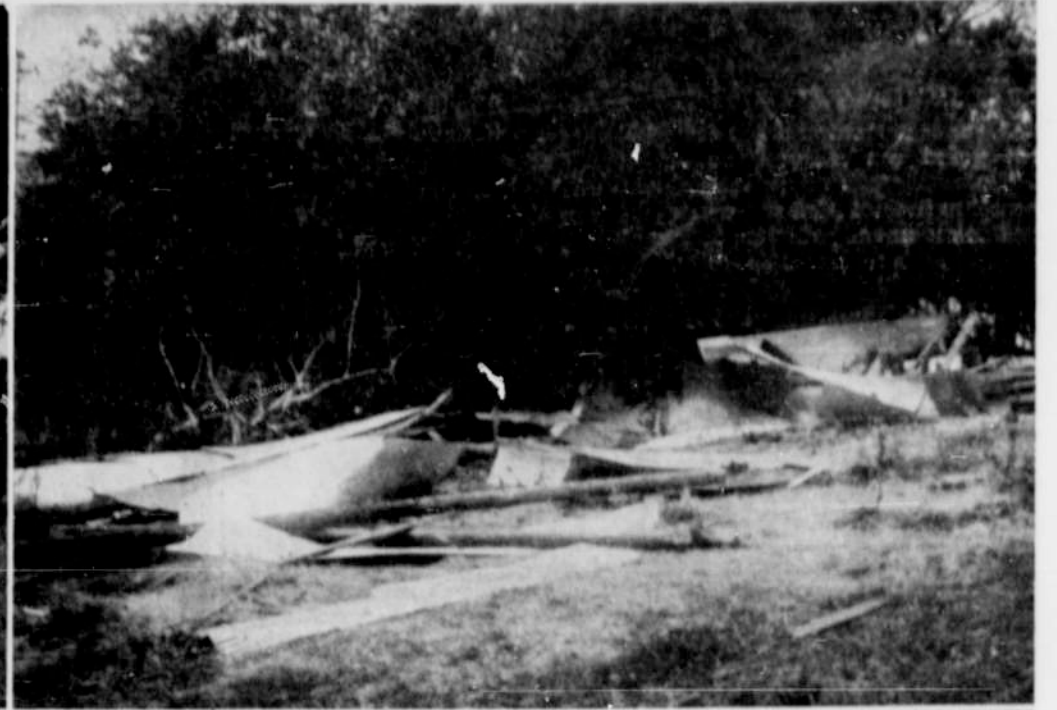
Mrs. Lenon and Steve stayed overnight with the Astoreca family and visited the Jess Asumendis before returning to Boise Saturday morning.
