

Nyssa Serves in Various Countries During 18-Year Career in U.S. Army

Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Maze of 515 North Eighth street recently received word that their son, Lieutenant Colonel Ralph E. Maze, has returned from an assignment with the United States Army in Vietnam.

Lt. Col. Maze entered the Army as an enlistee in November 1948 and completed basic training at Fort Ord, Calif. He then attended clerk-typist school at Fort Lee, Va., after which he was assigned as chief clerk of the S-1 office, 7th Cavalry regiment in Japan, where he served until April 1950.

He entered Officer's Candidate school at Fort Riley, Kan., graduating in October 1950. He then attended the Infantry Officer's school at Fort Benning, Ga., completing the course in December 1950.

From January 1951 to November 1953, Col. Maze was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division Training Center at Camp Breckinridge, Ky., where he was commander of a basic and advanced individual training company.

Serves During Korean Conflict

In January 1954, the colonel was assigned to Korea where he served with both the 24th and 25th Infantry Divisions as assistant regimental S-3 until October 1954 when he was sent to Hawaii with the 25th Division.

Shortly after going to the Hawaii area, he was assigned to the U.S. Army Pacific-Hawaiian Reserve, where he remained until June 1957. Returning to the U.S., he attended the Advanced Infantry Officer's school at Fort Benning and was graduated in December 1957.

From January 1958 to December 1960, Col. Maze was with the U.S. Army Armored Training Center at Fort Knox, where he served as commanding officer of Headquarters company, headquarters commandant and secretary of the general staff.

It was there that the colonel received his first Army Commendation medal for outstanding duty performance.

Assigned to Germany

From January 1961 through May 1961, Col. Maze attended the Command and General Staff college at Fort Leavenworth, Kan. Upon graduation, he was assigned to Northern Area Command in Frankfurt, Germany where he served as headquarters company commander, headquarters commandant and deputy inspector general, returning to the U.S. in June 1964.

Upon his return to the States, Col. Maze was assigned to Fort Carson, Colo., and served as executive officer. For duties performed during this assignment,

the colonel received his second Army Commendation medal with Oak Leaf cluster.

Receives Promotion in Vietnam

Col. Maze was assigned to Vietnam where he served as deputy inspector general, Headquarters Military Assistance Command, Vietnam. While in that country, he received his promotion to the grade of lieutenant colonel.

Upon his return from Vietnam, he was again assigned to Fort Carson and is deputy inspector general.

Lt. Col. and Mrs. Maze and their three children—Kirk, Kay and Kent—reside at 53 Monk street, Colorado Springs, Colo.
