

Emmett Overpowers Nyssa Bulldogs 28-13 in Huskies' Homecoming Tilt

The Emmett Huskies won their homecoming game 28-13 against the Nyssa Bulldogs last Friday evening on the Idaho gridiron. Neither team scored in the first quarter, but the Huskies broke loose for two touchdowns in the second period. Bill Gruble scored on a 10-yard pass from Mike Modorieta and Don Morgan scrambled 15 yards for the other tally.

A 79-yard pass from Jim Ableman to Tom Moore set up a score for Ableman. The kick failed and the scoreboard read 14-6 at halftime.

The Huskies scored touchdowns in each of the third and fourth quarters. Don Cox kicked all four of Emmett's extra points. In the final stanza, Pat Savage exploded through the line for a 63-yard touchdown. Mike Jefferies converted the PAT and the final tally was 28-13.

Statistics Reveal Close Game

A look at the statistics reveals a much closer game than the score implies. Emmett had 12 first downs compared to 11 for Nyssa and the Huskies gained only 159 yards rushing, while the Bulldogs had 222 yards.

The local team accounted for 139 yards passing and the Huskies had 141 via the aerial route.

Nyssa hosts the Enterprise Savages Friday evening, Oct. 14, in a 7-A2 contest.

Adrian coaches report it was a good defensive game and they were pleased with the plays contributed by Bill Skogan, Burdette Pratt, Rex Smith, Burton Burroughs, Julian Flores and Alan Zikmund.

The victory gave Adrian a 2-0 record in conference play and 3-1 for the season.

The Antelopes will host the Middleton squad Friday evening, Oct. 14, in their homecoming game.
